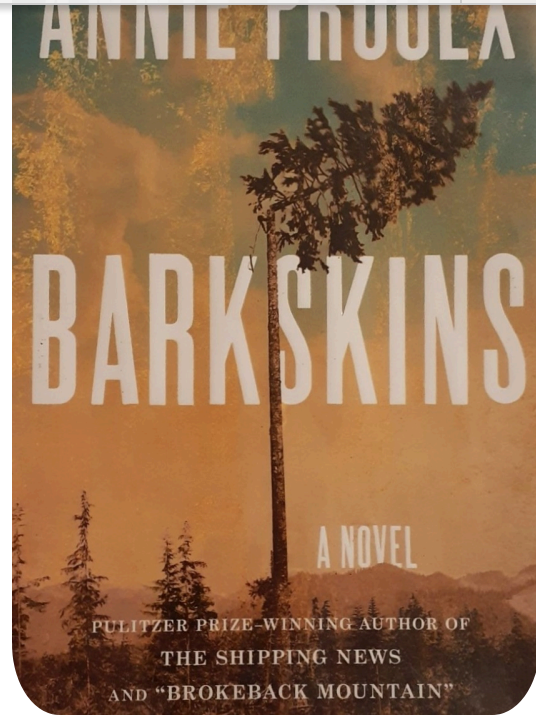
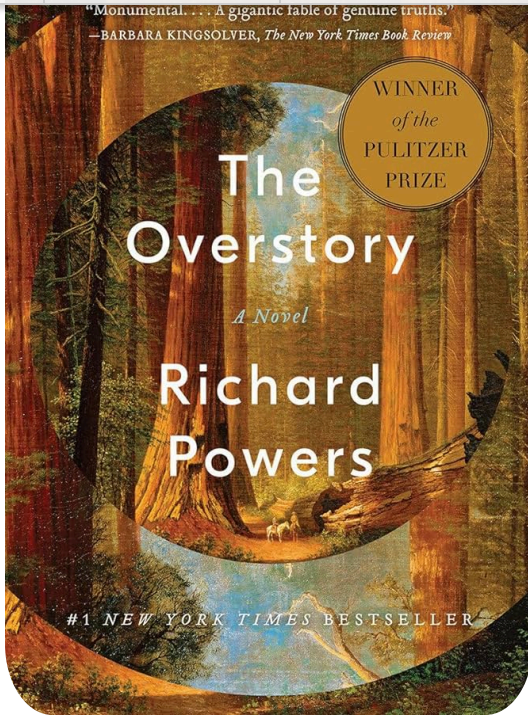

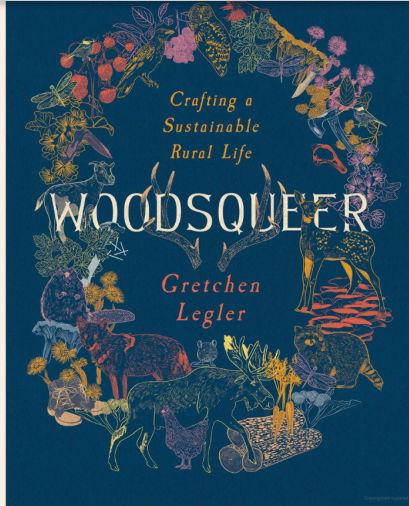

HEADER IMAGE: This tree has an Asiatic Bittersweet vine growing around it. You can see that the vine has been cut to stop the plant from choking the tree. Cutting is the ideal method for removal of this species. For larger vines, use the window cut method by making a cut on the stem at chest height and another at ankle height. For smaller vines, persistent cutting and digging up roots is needed as often as 6 times a year for 3 years.
